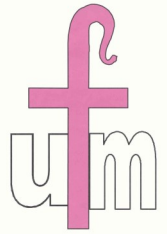

addictions, teen mothers, ex-convicts, the homeless, those affected by HIV/AIDS, the mentally ill, at-risk youth, abandoned children and others

who desperately need Jesus to heal and restore their shattered lives.



The vision of UFM is to help those who are spiritually and materially destitute to be reconciled to God through faith in Christ and reconciled to men, thus becoming productive members of society.



As people come to faith in Christ from lifestyles such as prostitution, alcoholism and crime, they face many challenges. Usually they must move away from their old friends and environments and into places conducive for spiritual growth. For this reason UFM provides them with accommodation where they live with UFM staff and are disciplined until they are strong enough to stand on their own. Most have never had legitimate jobs before and do not have any marketable job skills. So, along with discipleship UFM has a rehabilitation and training programme which aims to equip them to be responsible and productive members of society. Training is provided in areas such as computer applications and sewing.

The mission of UFM is to show Christ's compassion to the harassed and helpless in the urban world through evangelism, meeting physical need, discipleship and rehabilitation in order that they may experience freedom and maturity in Christ.
